October 8, 9 and 10, 2011*

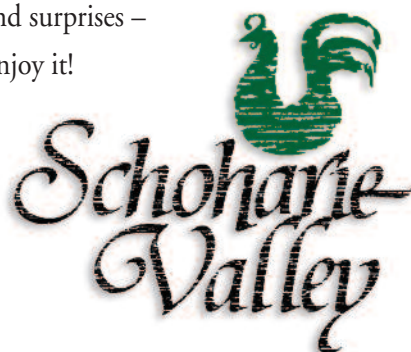
